This Term's Curriculum

Language & Literacy

We will explore narrative structures through classic folk tales and develop descriptive writing skills inspired by a range of books we will read as a class.

Science

Students will study forces and magnets, analyzing how things move on different surfaces.

Mathematics

Adding and subtracting 2-digit, then 3-digit numbers.

Multiplication and division;
Measuring lengths, mass and capacity.

History

We will be exploring the stone, bronze and iron age, looking at timelines, similarities and differences.
