



But everything is not as it seems. Stanley tries to dig up the truth in this inventive and darkly humorous tale of crime and punishment—and redemption.</p> <p>Clockwork by Philip Pullman</p>  <p>The odd tale is about Prince Otto and his young son Florian. Their hunting trip has led to the mysterious death of Otto but his body has returned with a moving clockwork arm. Clockwork's complicated and satisfying structure provides plenty of twists and turns.</p> <p>The hobbit by JRR Tolkien</p>  <p>The Hobbit is set within Tolkien's fictional universe and follows the quest of home-loving Bilbo Baggins, the titular hobbit, to win a share of the treasure guarded by Smaug the dragon. Maths

Focus: **Place Value**

Children will be looking at numbers up to a value of 10,000,000 and be introduced to negative numbers.

Focus: **Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division**

Children will be adding and subtracting integers. They will use formal methods to multiply and divide 4-digit and 2-digit numbers.

Science

Focus: **Light**
